Who May Attend the Academy?

Citizen's Police Academy students must meet the following criteria:

- 18 years of age or older
- Live, work, or volunteer in the City of St. Petersburg
- Pass a background check
- Have no prior felony convictions

Citizens involved with the community in some way, such as youth involvement, neighborhood watch, and civic groups, as well as family members of police officers, are very important to the academy and are encouraged to attend.

The class application process starts approximately one month prior to the Spring (April) and Fall (September) sessions.
